


Cincinnati-Dayton Urban Deer Unit



 Antlerless Deer Hunting Permits are Valid in the Shaded Areas.

The Cincinnati-Dayton Urban Deer Unit consists of the western half (west of SR 132 & south of SR 48) of Clermont County, Hamilton County, those portions of Warren and Butler counties bounded on the west by the Great Miami River and on the east by SR 48, in Montgomery County everything east of I-75 North and SR 48 North to the respective county lines.




OHIO URBAN DEER UNITS

(This information pertains to the use of Antlerless Deer Permits within Urban Units only. Refer to Ohio Hunting Regulations for more details.)

These directions represent the boundaries of the respective Urban Deer Units. They do not identify the specific locations within any Urban Deer Unit where hunting with an Antlerless Deer Permit is legal. Due to the problem of deer in urban areas, some cities, in cooperation with the ODNR Division of Wildlife, will be allowing archery hunting. Check with local authorities about these opportunities. It is the responsibility of the hunter to know and obey the rules and laws regarding the discharge of firearms and archery equipment. The designation of an Urban Deer Unit in **no way** supersedes existing firearm regulations or community prohibitions on hunting.

Columbus Urban Deer Unit




 Antlerless Deer Hunting Permits are Valid in the Shaded Areas.

The Columbus Urban Deer Unit includes all of Franklin County and that portion of Delaware County south of State Route 36 beginning at the Union-Delaware county line, then east to the junction of State Route 36 and State Route 36-37, then east along State Route 36-37 to the junction of State Routes 36-37 and 36-3, then northeast along State Route 36-3 and ending at the Delaware-Knox county line. All portions of Delaware County south of this line are included.

Cleveland-Akron Urban Deer Unit


 Antlerless Deer Hunting Permits are Valid in the Shaded Areas.



The Cleveland-Akron Urban Deer Unit is located in all of Lake and Cuyahoga counties and portions of Lorain, Medina, Summit, Stark, Portage, Geauga, and Wayne counties. Boundaries for this Unit begin at the point in Lorain County where State Route 58 intersects the Lake Erie shore, then south on State Route 58 to State Route 303, then east to Interstate 71, then south on Interstate 71 to State Route 18, then east on State Route 18 to State Route 21, then south on State Route 21 to U.S. Route 30, then east on U.S. Route 30 to State Route 44, then north on State Route 44 to Lake County.

Toledo Urban Deer Unit

 Antlerless Deer Hunting Permits are Valid in the Shaded Areas.



The Toledo Urban Deer Unit encompasses all of Lucas County and that portion of Wood County where State Route 64 intersects with the Maumee River, then runs north on State Route 65 to Five Point Road, then east on Five Point Road to State Route 25 north to Interstate 475 then east to Interstate 75, and ends where Interstate 75 meets the Maumee River.

Youngstown Urban Deer Unit

The Youngstown Urban Deer Unit is located in portions of Trumbull and Mahoning counties. Its boundary begins where the Ohio-Pennsylvania state line meets the Ohio Turnpike, runs northwest on the Ohio Turnpike to State Route 5, then east on State Route 5 to State Route 82, then east on State Route 82 to the Ohio-Pennsylvania state line, then south along the state line returning to the starting point.
